

Dear Mr. Poe:

I refer to your August 5 letter on behalf of Jamie Lee Jones and the August 17 telephone conversation between Patti Chapman of your staff and Jenny J. Foo of my staff regarding assistance to Ms. Jones.

Your office first contacted us on July 29 on behalf of Ms. Jones' father to report that Ms. Jones, a Kellogg Brown and Root contractor, had been raped in Iraq shortly after her arrival. Sharing your concern for Ms. Jones' welfare, we immediately contacted our Embassy in Baghdad, and learned that the Embassy's security officers were aware of Ms. Jones' case. We further learned that Embassy Baghdad officials were assisting Ms. Jones in obtaining medical and psychological treatment, ensuring that she was in a safe environment, and facilitating her return to the United States, which took place on August 1.

An officer in our Office of Victims Assistance followed up with Ms. Jones after her return to the United States, providing her with referral information for the local Rape Crisis Center and State Compensation Program in Houston. It is our understanding that Ms. Jones has also been in regular contact with Special Agent Lynn Falanga in the Diplomatic Security Service, which has been responsible for investigating the case.

Ms. Foo did say there a Embassy female (maybe Heidi McMichael) was with Jamie and should be with Jamie until she meets her father. I told Mr. Jones to have a privacy release made out, and as soon as Jamie signs it to fax it to us so we can officially work and get information on this case.

At 2130 Department of State Special Agents and Security arrived in HR. HR was advised by DoS not to have a further communication in anyway with the employee or with the investigation. DoS collected employee statements that employee provided to HR. DoS stated to KBR HR Jamie Armstrong [in the presence of KBR HR Mgr. and KBR Security] that if Jamie A. discussed anything with anyone surrounding victim's written statement that this is a violation of [federal] law. DoS advised Ms. Armstrong that even the CEO of KBR/Halliburton is not privy to the information on the employee's written statement.
